Thank you for visiting www.altimeter.com (the “Site”) owned and operated by Altimeter Capital Management, LP and its affiliates (“Altimeter,” “we,” or “us”). At Altimeter, we take your privacy seriously. Please read this Privacy Policy to learn how we treat the Personal Data (defined below) we collect in connection with your use of our Site.

By using or accessing our Site in any manner, you acknowledge that you accept the practices and policies outlined below, and you hereby consent that we will collect, use and disclose your information as described in this Privacy Policy.

Remember that your use of our Site is at all times subject to the Terms & Conditions, which incorporates this Privacy Policy. Any terms we use in this Policy without defining them have the definitions given to them in the Terms & Conditions.

As we continually work to improve our Site, we may need to change this Privacy Policy from time to time. We will alert you of material changes by placing a notice on the Site, by sending you an email and/or by some other means. Please note that if you’ve opted not to receive legal notice emails from us (or you haven’t provided us with your email address), those legal notices will still govern your use of the Site, and you are still responsible for reading and understanding them. If you use the Site after any changes to the Privacy Policy have been posted, that means you agree to all of the changes.

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What this Privacy Policy Covers

This Privacy Policy covers how we treat Personal Data that we may gather when you access or use our Site, but does not cover the practices of companies we don't own or control or people we don't manage, nor to the privacy practices of any entity with whom we have an investment relationship, even if you are able to access such entity's website or service through a link on the Site. It also does not apply to information obtained or disclosed in offline correspondence or in connection with an investment in one of the private investment funds and/or accounts managed by Altimeter (such entities, the "Funds"). If you are an investor in one of our Funds, please refer to the investor privacy notice in your subscription agreement or otherwise made available to you.

"Personal Data" means any information that identifies or relates to a particular individual and also includes information referred to as "personally identifiable information" or "personal information" or "sensitive personal information" under applicable data privacy laws, rules or regulations.

Personal Data

When you (or your authorized representatives on your behalf) engage with us (e.g., by sending us emails, contacting us via telephone or visiting the Site), we may receive Personal Information about you depending on your relationship with us, including:

Where you provide Personal Information on behalf of other individuals, you are responsible for notifying those individuals that you have provided their Personal Information to us and directing them to this Policy

so they understand how we will process their Personal Information.

We may also collect, use and share aggregated information such as statistical or demographic data. This information may be derived from your Personal Information, but will not directly or indirectly reveal your identity. For example, we may aggregate your usage information to calculate the percentage of users accessing a specific Website feature. However, if we combine or connect information with your Personal Information so that it can directly or indirectly identify you, we treat the combined information as Personal Information which will be processed in accordance with this Policy and, where applicable, other privacy notices or policies provided to you or otherwise made available by us from time to time.

Our Commercial or Business Purposes for Collecting Personal Data

We may collect and process your Personal Information for the following purposes:

- **Providing, Customizing and Improving the Site**
 - Providing you with the products, services or information you request.
 - Meeting or fulfilling the reason you provided the information to us.
 - Providing support and assistance for the Site.
 - Improving our Site, including testing, research, and internal analytics.
 - Doing fraud protection, security and debugging.
 - Carrying out other business purposes stated when collecting your Personal Data or as otherwise set forth in applicable data privacy laws, such as the California Consumer Privacy Act, as amended by the California Privacy Rights Act of 2020 (the “CCPA”).
- **Marketing the Services**
 - Marketing our services.
- **Corresponding with You**
 - Responding to correspondence that we receive from you, contacting you when necessary or requested, and sending you information about Altimeter or the Site.
 - Sending emails and other communications according to your preferences.

Other Permitted Purposes for Processing Personal Data

In addition, each of the above referenced categories of Personal Data may be collected, used, and disclosed with the government, including law enforcement, or other parties to meet certain legal requirements and enforcing legal terms including: fulfilling our legal obligations under applicable law, regulation, court order or other legal process, such as preventing, detecting and investigating security incidents and potentially illegal or prohibited activities; protecting the rights, property or safety of you,

Altimeter or another party; enforcing any agreements with you; responding to claims that any posting or other content violates third-party rights; and resolving disputes.

We will not collect additional categories of Personal Data or use the Personal Data we collected for materially different, unrelated or incompatible purposes without notifying you.

Categories of Sources of Personal Data

We may collect Personal Data about you from the following categories of sources:

- **You**
 - When you provide such information directly to us.
 - When you create an account or use our interactive tools and Site.
 - When you voluntarily provide information in any free-form text boxes through the Site or through responses to surveys or questionnaires.
 - When you send us an email or otherwise contact us.
 - When you use the Site and such information may be collected automatically.
 - Through Cookies (defined in the “Cookies” section below).
- **Third Parties**
 - Advertising Partners
 - We may receive information about you from some of our vendors who assist us with marketing or promotional services related to how you interact with us and our Site (such as lead providers).
 - Vendors
 - We may use analytics providers to analyze how you interact and engage with the Site, or third parties may help us provide you with customer support.

How We May Disclose Your Personal Data

We may disclose your Personal Data to the categories of service providers and other parties listed in this section. Depending on state laws that may be applicable to you, some of these disclosures may constitute a “sale” of your Personal Data. For more information, please refer to the state-specific sections below.

- **Service Providers.** These parties help us provide the Site or perform business functions on our behalf, such as hosting, technology and communication providers; security and fraud prevention consultants; communications providers; and analytics providers.
- **Parties You Authorize, Access or Authenticate.** These parties may include third parties you access through the Site; businesses that you have a relationship with; or other third parties that you authorize.

Legal Obligations

We may disclose any Personal Data that we collect with third parties in conjunction with any of the activities set forth under “Other Permitted Purposes for Processing Personal Data” section above.

Business Transfers

All of your Personal Data that we collect may be transferred to a third party if we undergo a merger, acquisition, bankruptcy or other transaction in which that third party assumes control of our business (in whole or in part).

Data that is Not Personal Data

We may create aggregated, de-identified or anonymized data from the Personal Data we collect, including by removing information that makes the data personally identifiable to a particular user. We may use such aggregated, de-identified or anonymized data and disclose it with third parties for our lawful business purposes, including to analyze, build and improve the Site and promote our business, provided that we will not disclose such data in a manner that could identify you. We will not attempt to re-identify you from any aggregated, de-identified or anonymized data.

Third-Party Links

The Website, from time to time, contains links to and from third party websites. If you follow a link to any of these websites, please note that these websites have their own privacy policies and that we do not accept any responsibility or liability for these websites or their related policies. Please check these policies before you submit any Personal Information via these websites.

Cookies

Our Site may use cookies and similar technologies such as pixel tags, web beacons, clear GIFs and JavaScript (collectively, “Cookies”) to help operationalize and improve our Site. Cookies are small pieces of data— usually text files – placed on your computer, tablet, phone or similar device when you use that device to access our Site. Please note that because of our use of Cookies, the Site does not support “Do Not Track” requests sent from a browser at this time.

We may use the following types of Cookies:

- Essential Cookies. Essential Cookies are required for providing you with features or services that you have requested.
- Functional Cookies. Functional Cookies are used to record your choices and settings regarding our Site, maintain your preferences over time and recognize you when you return to our Site. These Cookies help us to personalize our content for you, greet you by name and remember your preferences (for example, your choice of language or region).

- Performance/Analytical Cookies. Performance/Analytical Cookies allow us to understand how visitors use our Site. They do this by collecting information about the number of visitors to the Site, what pages visitors view on our Site and how long visitors are viewing pages on the Site.

You can decide whether or not to accept Cookies through your internet browser's settings. Most browsers have an option for turning off the Cookie feature, which will prevent your browser from accepting new Cookies, as well as (depending on the sophistication of your browser software) allow you to decide on acceptance of each new Cookie in a variety of ways. You can also delete all Cookies that are already on your device. If you do this, however, you may have to manually adjust some preferences every time you visit our Site and some of the Site and its functionalities may not work. Data Security

We seek to protect your Personal Data from unauthorized access, use and disclosure using appropriate physical, technical, organizational and administrative security measures based on the type of Personal Data and how we are processing that data. You should also help protect your data by appropriately selecting and protecting your password and/or other sign-on mechanism; limiting access to your computer or device and browser; and signing off after you have finished accessing your account. Although we work to protect the security of your account and other data that we hold in our records, please be aware that no method of transmitting data over the internet or storing data is completely secure.

Data Retention

We retain Personal Data about you for as long as necessary to provide you with our Site or to perform our business or commercial purposes for collecting your Personal Data. When establishing a retention period for specific categories of data, we consider who we collected the data from, our need for the Personal Data, why we collected the Personal Data, and the sensitivity of the Personal Data. In some cases we retain Personal Data for longer, if doing so is necessary to comply with our legal obligations, resolve disputes or collect fees owed, or is otherwise permitted or required by applicable law, rule or regulation. We may further retain information in an anonymous or aggregated form where that information would not identify you personally.

Personal Data of Children

As noted in the Terms & Conditions, our Site is only intended for individuals who are at least 18 years of age, and we do not knowingly collect or solicit Personal Data from individuals under the age of 18. If you are under the age of 18, please do not use the Site or send us any Personal Data. If we learn we have collected Personal Data from a child under 18 years of age, we will delete that information as quickly as possible. If you believe that a child under 18 years of age may have provided Personal Data to us, please contact us at compliance@altimeter.com.

California Resident Rights

If you are a California resident, you have the rights set forth in this section. Please see the “Exercising Your California Rights” section below for instructions regarding how to exercise these rights. Please note that we may process Personal Data of our customers’ end users or employees in connection with our provision of certain services to our customers. If we are processing your Personal Data as a service provider, you should contact the entity that collected your Personal Data in the first instance to address your rights with respect to such data. Additionally, please note that these rights are subject to certain conditions and exceptions under applicable law, which may permit or require us to deny your request.

If there are any conflicts between this section and any other provision of this Privacy Policy and you are a California resident, the portion that is more protective of Personal Data shall control to the extent of such conflict. If you have any questions about this section or whether any of the following rights apply to you, please contact us at compliance@altimeter.com.

Access

You have the right to request certain information about our collection and use of your Personal Data. In response, we will provide you with the following information regarding the preceding 12 months:

- The categories of Personal Data that we have collected about you.
- The categories of sources from which that Personal Data was collected.
- The business or commercial purpose for collecting or selling your Personal Data.
- The categories of third parties with whom we have shared your Personal Data.
- The specific pieces of Personal Data that we have collected about you.

If we have disclosed your Personal Data to any third parties for a business purpose over the past 12 months, we will identify the categories of Personal Data shared with each category of third party recipient. If we have sold your Personal Data over the past 12 months, we will identify the categories of Personal Data sold to each category of third party recipient.

You may request the above information beyond the 12-month period, but no earlier than January 1, 2022. If you do make such a request, we are required to provide that information unless doing so proves

impossible or would involve disproportionate effort.

Deletion

You have the right to request that we delete the Personal Data that we have collected about you. Under the CCPA, this right is subject to certain exceptions: for example, we may need to retain your Personal Data to provide you with the Site or complete a transaction or other action you have requested, or if deletion of your Personal Data involves disproportionate effort. If your deletion request is subject to one of these exceptions, we may deny your deletion request.

Correction

You have the right to request that we correct any inaccurate Personal Data we have collected about you. Under the CCPA, this right is subject to certain exceptions: for example, if we decide, based on the totality of circumstances related to your Personal Data, that such data is correct. If your correction request is subject to one of these exceptions, we may deny your request.

“Selling,” or “Sharing”; Targeted Advertising

We do not sell or share your Personal Data for targeted advertising purposes.

Limit the Use of Sensitive Personal Information

Consumers have certain rights over the processing of their sensitive personal information. However, we do not collect sensitive personal information.

We Will Not Discriminate Against You for Exercising Your Rights Under the CCPA

We will not discriminate against you for exercising your rights under the CCPA. We will not deny you our goods or services, charge you different prices or rates, or provide you a lower quality of goods and services if you exercise your rights under the CCPA. However, we may offer different tiers of our Site as allowed by applicable data privacy laws (including the CCPA) with varying prices, rates or levels of quality of the goods or services you receive related to the value of Personal Data that we receive from you.

Exercising Your California Rights

Except as otherwise provided in this Privacy Policy, you can exercise the rights described in this Privacy Policy. To do so, you or your Authorized Agent (defined below) must send us a request that (1) provides sufficient information to allow us to verify that you are the person about whom we have collected Personal Data (such as your name and email address), and (2) describes your request in sufficient detail to allow us to understand, evaluate and respond to it. Each request that meets both of these criteria will be considered a “Valid Request.” We may not respond to requests that do not meet these criteria. We will only use Personal Data provided in a Valid Request to verify your identity and complete your request. You do not need an account to submit a Valid Request.

We will work to respond to your Valid Request within the time period required by applicable law. We will not charge you a fee for making a Valid Request unless your Valid Request(s) is excessive, repetitive or manifestly unfounded. If we determine that your Valid Request warrants a fee, we will notify you of the fee and explain that decision before completing your request.

You may submit a Valid Request for any rights afforded to you in this Privacy Policy by emailing us at compliance@altimeter.com.

You may also authorize an agent (an “Authorized Agent”) to exercise your rights on your behalf. To do this, you must provide your Authorized Agent with written permission to exercise your rights on your behalf, and we may request a copy of this written permission from your Authorized Agent when they make a request on your behalf.

Other State Law Privacy Rights

California Resident Rights

Under California Civil Code Sections 1798.83-1798.84, California residents are entitled to contact us to prevent disclosure of Personal Data to third parties for such third parties’ direct marketing purposes; in order to submit such a request, please contact us at compliance@altimeter.com.

Your browser may offer you a “Do Not Track” option, which allows you to signal to operators of websites and web applications and services that you do not wish such operators to track certain of your online activities over time and across different websites. Nevada Resident Rights

If you are a resident of Nevada, you have the right to opt-out of the sale of certain Personal Data to third parties. Please note that we do not currently sell your Personal Data as sales are defined in Nevada Revised Statutes Chapter 603A.

European Union and United Kingdom Data Subject Rights

EU and UK Residents

If you are a resident of the European Union (“EU”), United Kingdom (“UK”), Liechtenstein, Norway or Iceland, you may have additional rights under the EU or UK General Data Protection Regulation (the “GDPR”) with respect to your Personal Data, as outlined below.

For this section, we use the terms “Personal Data” and “processing” as they are defined in the GDPR, but “Personal Data” generally means information that can be used to individually identify a person, and “processing” generally covers actions that can be performed in connection with data such as collection,

use, storage and disclosure. Altimeter will be the controller of your Personal Data processed in connection with the Site.

If there are any conflicts between this section and any other provision of this Privacy Policy, the policy or portion that is more protective of Personal Data shall control to the extent of such conflict. If you have any questions about this section or whether any of the following applies to you, please contact us at compliance@altimeter.com. Note that we may also process certain Personal Data in connection with our provision of certain services to other entities, in which case we are the processor of Personal Data. If we are the processor of your Personal Data (i.e., not the controller), please contact the controller party in the first instance to address your rights with respect to such data.

Personal Data We May Collect

The “Categories of Personal Data We May Collect” section above details the Personal Data that we may collect from you.

Personal Data Use and Processing Grounds

The “Our Commercial or Business Purposes for Collecting Personal Data” section above explains how we may use your Personal Data.

We will only process your Personal Data if we have a lawful basis for doing so. Lawful bases for processing include consent, contractual necessity and our “legitimate interests” or the legitimate interest of others, as further described below.

- Contractual Necessity: We may process the following categories of Personal Data as a matter of “contractual necessity”, meaning that we need to process the data to perform under our Terms & Conditions with you, which enables us to provide you with the Site. When we process data due to contractual necessity, failure to provide such Personal Data will result in your inability to use some or all portions of the Site that require such data.
 - Contact Data
 - Login Data
 - Device/IP Data
 - Other Identifying Information that You Voluntarily Choose to Provide
- Legitimate Interest: We may process the following categories of Personal Data when we believe it furthers the legitimate interest of us or third parties:
 - Contact Data
 - Login Data
 - Device/IP Data

- Web Analytics
- Other Identifying Information that You Voluntarily Choose to Provide
- We may also de-identify or anonymize Personal Data to further our legitimate interests.

Examples of these legitimate interests include (as described in more detail above):

- Providing, customizing and improving the Site.
- Corresponding with you.
- Meeting legal requirements and enforcing legal terms.
- Completing corporate transactions.
- Consent: In some cases, we may process Personal Data based on the consent you expressly grant to us at the time we collect such data. When we process Personal Data based on your consent, it will be expressly indicated to you at the point and time of collection.
- Other Processing Grounds: From time to time we may also need to process Personal Data to comply with a legal obligation, if it is necessary to protect the vital interests of you or other data subjects, or if it is necessary for a task carried out in the public interest.

Disclosing Personal Data

The “How We May Disclose Your Personal Data” section above details how we disclose your Personal Data with third parties.

EU, UK and Swiss Data Subject Rights

You have certain rights with respect to your Personal Data, including those set forth below. For more information about these rights, or to submit a request, please email us at compliance@altimeter.com. Please note that in some circumstances, we may not be able to fully comply with your request, such as if it is frivolous or extremely impractical, if it jeopardizes the rights of others, or if it is not required by law, but in those circumstances, we will still respond to notify you of such a decision. In some cases, we may also need you to provide us with additional information, which may include Personal Data, if necessary to verify your identity and the nature of your request.

- **Access**: You can request more information about the Personal Data we hold about you and request a copy of such Personal Data.
- **Rectification**: If you believe that any Personal Data we are holding about you is incorrect or incomplete, you can request that we correct or supplement such data.
- **Erasure**: You can request that we erase some or all of your Personal Data from our systems.
- **Withdrawal of Consent**: If we are processing your Personal Data based on your consent (as indicated at the time of collection of such data), you have the right to withdraw your consent at any time. Please

note, however, that if you exercise this right, you may have to then provide express consent on a case-by-case basis for the use or disclosure of certain of your Personal Data, if such use or disclosure is necessary to enable you to utilize some or all of our Site.

- **Portability:** You can ask for a copy of your Personal Data in a machine-readable format. You can also request that we transmit the data to another controller where technically feasible.
- **Objection:** You can contact us to let us know that you object to the further use or disclosure of your Personal Data for certain purposes, such as for direct marketing purposes.
- **Restriction of Processing:** You can ask us to restrict further processing of your Personal Data.
- **Right to File Complaint:** You have the right to lodge a complaint about Altimeter's practices with respect to your Personal Data with the supervisory authority of your country or EU Member State. Transfers of Personal Data

The Site is hosted and operated in the United States ("U.S.") through Altimeter and its service providers, and if you do not reside in the U.S., laws in the U.S. may differ from the laws where you reside. By using the Site, you acknowledge that any Personal Data about you, regardless of whether provided by you or obtained from a third party, is being provided to Altimeter in the U.S. and will be hosted on U.S. servers, and you authorize Altimeter to transfer, store and process your information to and in the U.S., and possibly other countries. In some circumstances, your Personal Data may be transferred to the U.S. pursuant to standard data protection clauses.
